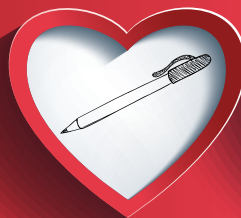

dreams of escape.

She leaves for a year in Jerusalem where she meets Baruch, and twelve weeks later they are engaged. Shtayim Dubim : Two She-Bears

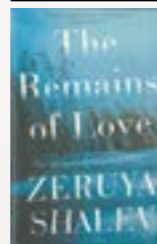


The newest novel by Meir Shalev - one of Israel's most celebrated authors.

and the other whom she loved too much. Avner, the beloved son, grows up to be an anguished man disillusioned by his work and trapped in a loveless marriage. Dina, Hemda's daughter, tries to give her daughter Nitzan the warmth she never received from her own mother. Shalev's electrifying new novel is at once an exploration of the state of modern Israel and also of family, yearning, compromise and the pull of the past.

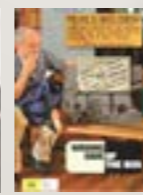

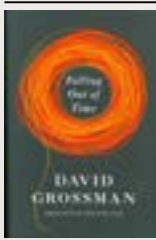

On June 25, 1894, inspired by the growing masses of lady cyclists, 23 year old Annie Cohen-Kopchovsky left her children and husband in their Boston home and set off on an epic journey.

Based on a bet wagered by two wealthy Boston businessmen that a woman could not ride around the world on a bicycle, Annie Londonderry (as she later called herself) became a symbol of women's equality. An entertaining blend of social history and high adventure, this is a portrait of a remarkable woman, a free spirit who cycled her way out of Victorian constraints.

Falling Out Of Time



David Grossman

In *Falling out of time*, David Grossman creates a genre defying drama – part play, part prose, pure poetry – to tell the story of bereaved parents setting out to reach their lost children.

In a small village, a man called "The Walking Man" sets off on a journey to find his lost son. People from the town, all enduring a loss of their own, join him on his journey. The walkers raise questions of grief and bereavement. Can death be overcome by an intensity of speech or memory? Is it possible to call to the dead and free them from their death if only for a moment? An incandescent fable of parental grief – a powerful distilled experience of understanding and acceptance, and of art's triumph over death.

When five curious little gefilte fish set off on an adventure to explore the world, Mama Gefilte is

not too happy. Oy vey!!! But shes taught them well and at the end they all prove to be mensch – making Mama one proud gefilte!!! 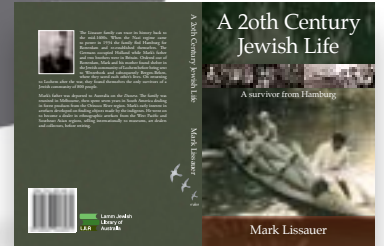
